Municipal Code



Code States:

12.24.110 Maintenance of trees in parkway areas.

It shall be the responsibility of the city to maintain, trim and repair trees in the public right-of-way, with the exception of providing water to such trees. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to provide necessary water to maintain the growth, health and beauty of such trees and to trim away any low growth of the tree, such as suckers and shoots, that may interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic. (Prior code § 7240.11)

Include first paragraph of Introduction from 1997 Urban Forest Management Plan.	Parts of 1997 Introduction have been included with modifications – see Purpose on page 2.
Consider changing reference to risk assessments.	Inspection interval has been changed from four years to six years – Section 2-A. Risk assessments are performed by City staff between trim cycles at the request of the public.
Consider removing reference to "aerial inspections."	Reference removed – see Section 2-B.
Remove and replace "we" in Section 2.	Removed and changed to "the City" – see Section 2-C.
Include protection of bats in Section 3 Tree Care for Birds and Other Wildlife.	The UFMP has been updated to reference the most recent Tree Care for Wildlife Best Management Practices (2022) as a guidance document for City staff and City tree contractors – see Section 3-D and Appendix A.

Include Parkway Tree Maintenance Policy in UMFP	Responsibility of Property Owner, from Parkway Tree Maintenance Policy, has been added as Section 3-I.	
Include guidelines for stake removal.	Guideline for stake removal has been added to Responsibility of Property Owner – see Section 3-I.	
Removing a tree because it poses a public nuisance does not align with the Tree Care Ordinance.	Reference removed from UFMP – see Section 5-B. Reasons a tree will not be considered for removal (from Tree Care Ordinance No. 1913) has been added – see Section 5-B.	
UFMP Section 5 Tree Removal should refer to Tree Care Ordinance No. 1913 Section 12.26.060 Tree Removal and Replacement Program rather than duplicate information.	Reference to Tree Care Ordinance No. 1913 and how the UFMP complements the Ordinance has been added – see Section 5-B.

Include provision from 1997 UFMP, stating that proposed revisions to approved tree palette should be discussed at a Street Tree Advisory Committee meeting and subject to final approval of City Council.	Refer to Tree Care Ordinance Section 12.26.035.
Include Tree Replacement Program from 1997 UFMP.	Including the program is not currently feasible due to operational constraints, including funding. A tree replacement program is not practical in locations with historical or heritage trees.
Include a policy regarding new developers to provide ample parkway space for larger trees.	Addressed in the General Plan, not UFMP.
Include Tree Donation Program.	The Tree Donation Program is a City program, not a maintenance practice.
Include tree maintenance, removal, and replacement guidelines for HOAs.	The UFMP pertains only to trees in the public right-of-way.
