Background: City's Status

UPLAND CITY HALL

- Current financial status
 - Strongest financial position in terms of reserves in decades
 - Hundreds of millions of dollars of deferred maintenance not on the books
- New understanding of deferred maintenance amounts
 - o Pavement Management Master Plan and Sidewalk Master Plan have shown significant unfunded amounts
- Residents voting No on Measure N (2024) and Measure L (2022)
 - Despite below average roads and annual deferred maintenance needs greater than what a sales tax would raise, residents have voted down ballot measures twice in the last three years.

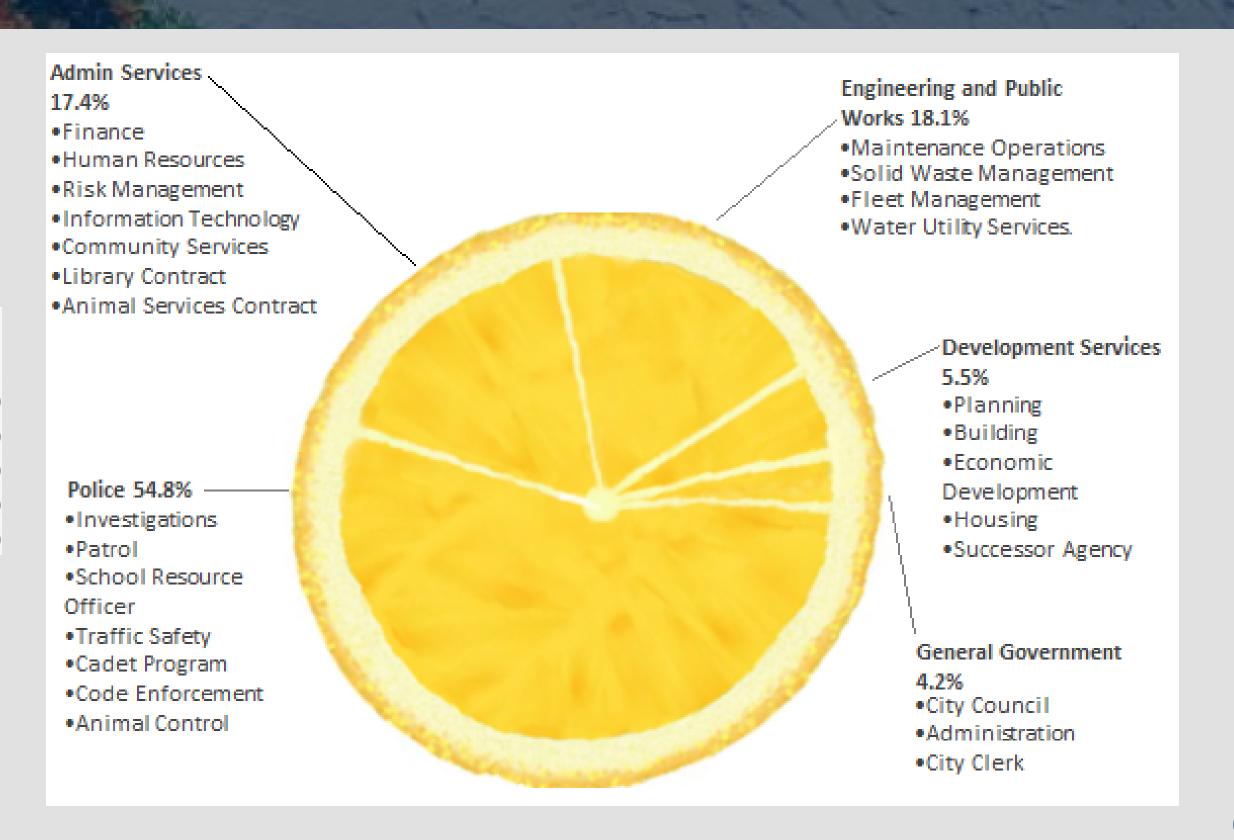

Considerations to address deferred maintenance needs

- Program/Cost reductions
 - Removal of items such as those listed in the staff report
- Adjustments to General Fund Reserve Policy
 - Modifications of collections of reserves
- Policy adjustments
 - Consideration of policies that could reduce/redirect expenses
 - Consideration of policies that could increase funding opportunities
