SUBJECT: REVIEW OF URBAN FOREST MANAGEMENT PLAN CHANGES, CITIZENS APPEALS,

AND RISK MANAGEMENT CLAIMS

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Public Works Committee receive and file this report confirming that no changes have been made to the Urban Forest Management Plan, no citizen appeals have been filed, and that all risk-related matters continue to be managed by the City's Risk Management Division, in accordance with Upland Municipal Code §12.26.110.

GOAL STATEMENT

This action supports the City's goal of maintaining a healthy, safe, and sustainable urban forest and ensuring transparent and responsive tree management practices in the public right-of-way

BACKGROUND

The Public Works Committee serves a vital role in guiding the management and preservation of the City's Urban Forest. The Committee is responsible for reviewing the Urban Forest Management Plan approximately every five years and recommending updates to ensure the Plan reflects current arboricultural standards, sustainability goals, and community needs.

In Fiscal Year 2024/25, the Upland City Council adopted the Urban Forest Management Plan, which outlines a comprehensive strategy for the care, protection, and enhancement of public trees. The Plan remains in effect through Fiscal Year 2029/30.

In addition to its planning responsibilities, the Public Works Committee is also tasked with hearing and deciding citizen appeals related to tree matters, as outlined in Upland Municipal Code §12.26.110.

Furthermore, while no formal action is required, the Committee shall be informed of any claims involving public trees. This information may be considered when evaluating future revisions to the Urban Forest Management Plan.

ISSUES AND ANALYSIS

The following responsibilities are assigned to the Street Tree Advisory Committee:

- 1. Urban Forest Management Plan Review:
 - o There have been no changes to the Urban Forest Plan previously adopted
- 2. Citizen Appeals Upland Municipal Code §12.26.110:
 - o There have been no Citizens Appeals since our last meeting
- 3. Risk Management Claims:
 - The Claims are brought to the Public Works Committee for their information. See the attached Claims log

SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF PLACING UTILITY BILLS ON THE SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY

TAX ROLLS

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Public Works Committee receive and file this report.

GOAL STATEMENT

This action supports the City's goal of maintaining fiscal sustainability and providing efficient, cost-effective utility services. Ensuring timely revenue collection through the County tax roll helps protect the stability of enterprise funds and avoids service interruptions or delays in capital projects.

BACKGROUND

The City of Upland operates its sewer, water, and solid waste programs as enterprise funds – self-supporting programs funded entirely through user fees. Prior to 2018, delinquent utility bills were enforced through water shutoffs. With the passage of SB 998 – Water Shutoff Protection Act, effective February 1, 2020, cities could no longer discontinue water service for non-payment of sewer and trash charges.

The situation was further complicated during the COVID-19 pandemic, when Executive Order N-42-20 suspended shutoffs entirely from March 2020 through December 2021. As a result, the City saw a significant increase in unpaid utility accounts. Sewer service cannot be legally shut off under State Water Resources Control Board rules, and solid waste service is mandatory under the Public Resources and Health and Safety Codes.

The current collection process relies on a lien system that can take over 400 days for recovery – delaying revenue and increasing administrative burdens. The City must now consider long-term strategies to ensure collections are made efficiently, fairly, and in a legally compliant manner.

ISSUES AND ANALYSIS

The City has three primary options:

Option 1: Do Nothing

- Keeps existing billing and lien processes.
- Collections delayed by more than a year.
- Capital projects postponed due to cash flow uncertainty.
- Increased admin, printing, and collection costs.

Option 2: Place Bills on County Tax Roll (Recommended)

- Ensures timely collection with payments tied to property taxes.
- Legally enforceable without service shutoffs.
- Reduces bad debt risk and stabilizes enterprise fund budgets.
- Streamlines admin processes and lowers long-term costs.

Option 3: Third-Party Collection

- Outsources recovery to a collection agency.
- Involves commission fees and no guarantee of payment.
- Less efficient than tax roll and could create negative public perception.
